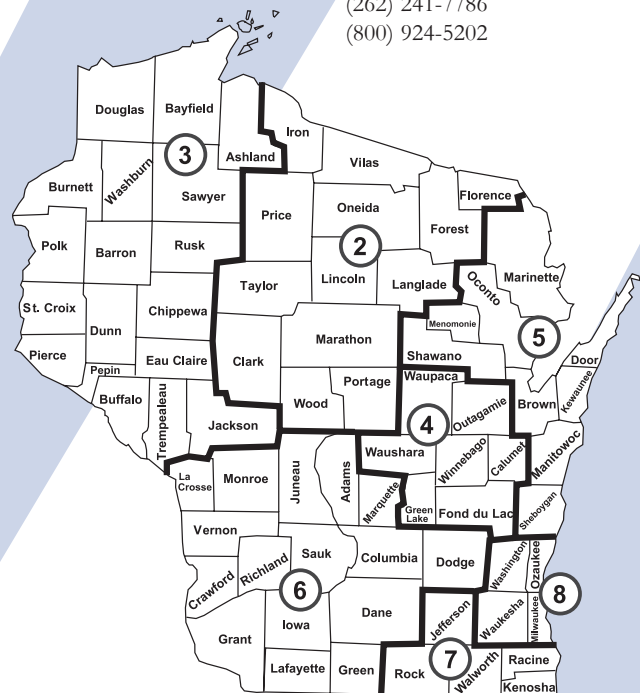

Whether it's running, walking, biking, horseback riding, roller blading or driving a support vehicle, law enforcement personnel will carry the Flame of Hope from every corner of Wisconsin to the Special Olympics State Summer Games in Stevens Point.

2:30 p.m. LETR Parade through downtown Stevens Point. Meet at corner of Church Street and College Court (behind the US Post Office). The parade will run through downtown and end at the Country Springs Hotel (host hotel).

3:00 p.m. Check-in begins at host hotel, Country Springs Hotel Conference & Convention Center. Call 800-998-2311 before May 11 for reservations and ask for the Torch Run block. Room rates are: \$74 single/double; \$79 triple/quadruple; \$105 dome; \$119 hospitality; \$179 suite.

5:00 p.m. Pizza and subs poolside (Pinery/Dome), Country Springs Hotel. Raffle ticket sales begin.

6:00 p.m. Torch Run participants form gauntlet at entrance of Opening Ceremonies to greet athletes as they arrive. Officers welcome to bring patches, decals, etc. to give to athletes.

7:00 p.m. Summer Games Opening Ceremonies

8:30 p.m. Torch Run Celebration: snacks, music and slide show of day's festivities. Raffle continues, winners drawn at 10:00 p.m. - Country Springs Hotel

## Mission of the Law Enforcement Torch Run®

The mission of the Law Enforcement Torch Run® (LETR) for Special Olympics Wisconsin is to raise funds for and awareness of the Special Olympics movement. Special Olympics is a program which reaffirms the beliefs that with hope and dedication, we can see achievement and self-worth realized by any individual.



It is our belief that persons with cognitive disabilities, through their involvement in Special Olympics, show their communities there are no limits to their potential.

The Law Enforcement Torch Run is the largest grassroots fund raiser and public awareness vehicle in the world for Special Olympics. Law enforcement officers from the 50 United States, 10 Canadian provinces and territories, and 35 countries carry the Flame of Hope in honor of the Special Olympics athletes.

In 2006, Wisconsin celebrated the 20th Anniversary of the Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics. At the Opening Ceremony, a new cauldron was dedicated to honor the commitment of officers in the law enforcement community.

Internationally, the LETR raised a record \$25.5 million in its 25th year, a true testimonial to the dedication and spirit the law enforcement community has for Special Olympics. Dedicated LETR supporters in Wisconsin raised more than \$1.3 million of this international total.

At the International Law Enforcement Torch Run conference, Wisconsin's Torch Run received third place in the Highest Funds Raised Per Capita (raising 25¢ per resident of our state), Fifth Largest Program in the World and one of eight programs to receive the Diamond Award for raising more than \$1 million in 2006. Wisconsin also had the third biggest World's Largest Truck Convoy in 2006 out of 44 taking place.
